



Membership Requirements

- Be licensed and/or certified by the State of Minnesota for the appropriate profession (as required) without restriction.
- Be actively employed in their field of licensure/training.
- Current Background Check via Minnesota Responds.
- Members must be able to respond rapidly to a deployment request regarding availability.
- Personally be prepared to be deployed for 24 - 72 hours.
- Be physically and mentally able to handle the increased demands placed on them when deployed in a disaster situation.
- Adhere to the Attendance Requirements policy.
- Must be registered with MN Responds.

Training Provided

- NIMS 100, 200, 700, and 800 (to be completed online)
- ICS 300 may be provided
- Psychological First Aid (either face to face or online at a predetermined site)
- Additional training required by discipline

Deployment Conditions

To support the mission of the MMT, the team may be deployed to a disaster environment in order to save/sustain lives. This may require that the team function in extreme, austere and ever-changing work and living environments. These conditions could be, however not limited to:

- Working shifts lasting 12 or more hours with limited breaks
- Stand for 8 or more hours at a time
- Regular walking or climbing on non-level surfaces
- Dusty or dirty air requiring wearing a mask or respirator for hours at a time
- Temperature extremes (<32 F, >100 F degrees with 90% humidity) working at night or in the dark
- Repeated lifting/carrying of heavy equipment or patients
- Driving unfamiliar vehicles in unfamiliar surroundings
- Working and living without basic services (water, electricity, telephone, heating/cooling, warm meals, showers, laundry, lack of privacy)
- Poor sleeping environment: cots, or ground, noisy, daylight.

To support the goal to ensure the integrity of the healthcare infrastructure and safety and health of all deployed personnel, there may be physical, medical and/or psychological reasons that would be limiting to active deployment. It is not the intent of the MMT to list these conditions, rather it is the responsibility of the team member to recognize his/her health and discuss with any command staff personnel prior to or during deployment, if it could be limiting.
