2024 NWS Extreme Heat Webinars

The NWS Public Program will be hosting two webinars for NWS partners and users to prepare for the upcoming heat season. These webinars are open to all NWS partners and users, including Weather-Ready Nation Ambassadors, media, emergency management, and federal, state, tribal, and local governments.

The first webinar, on April 22, 2024 from 2:00-3:30 PM EDT / 11:00 AM-12:30 PM PDT, is a joint webinar from the NWS and CDC covering the NWS Experimental HeatRisk tool, which is expanding across the contiguous U.S. on April 22. The webinar will provide an overview of NWS Experimental HeatRisk, describing what it is, how it works, and how to understand it. Please <u>register here</u>.

The second webinar, on May 13, 2024 from 1:00-2:00 PM EDT / 10:00-11:00 AM PDT, will provide information on the many NWS heat-related products and services issued across the agency, covering a continuum of timescales. The webinar will cover current operational heat-related products from the Climate Prediction Center, Weather Prediction Center, and local Weather Forecast Offices, and will detail the future plans and initiatives related to heat. NWS partners and users are also encouraged to follow and participate in the National Integrated Heat Health Information System (NIHHIS) **Heat Safety Awareness Social Media Campaign**, which will take place **April 29 - May 3, 2024.** Throughout the week, NWS partners and users can learn and share information about heat-related illness, pediatric vehicular heatstroke, personal risk factors associated with heat, and heat-related tools and resources. - On-line modular training offered by coalition in 2024:
 - August 26th-29th,
 - October 28th-31st.
- Sessions will be offered 0800-1000 or 2000-2200 each day, attendees must attend 1 session per day for the entire 4-day period (8-hours total).
- This training will get the attendee a FEMA certificate of completion
- 3-hour Fee for service hands on sessions can be scheduled after if desired by your agency/facility (not required)
